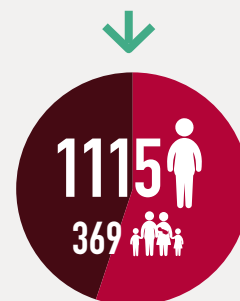

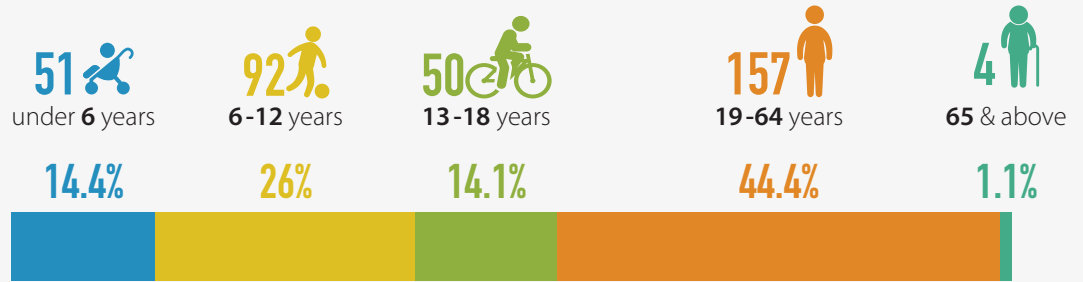

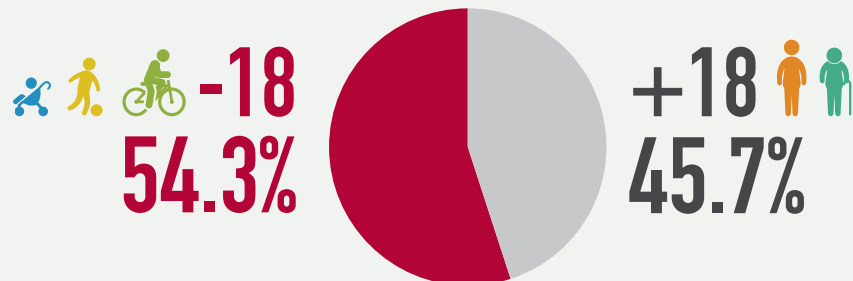
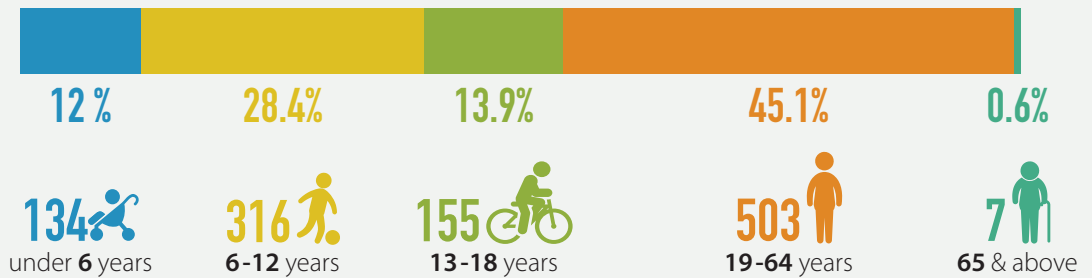


AGE BREAKDOWN

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2022

- » We are planning for a significant (no specific annual target yet) number of **Afghan** refugees as part of Canada's special multi-year commitment;
- » **GAR** Source countries will continue to reflect last year arrival flows from Afghanistan, Syria and several countries in Africa;
- » **ISSofBC** will be establishing another specific Resettlement Assistance Program temporary housing and reception service hub within Metro Vancouver, specifically within the City of Surrey; and,
- » New and/or expanded **GAR** destining sites/targets will be contracted by the **IRCC BC Region to include more sites outside Metro Vancouver including Victoria, Nanaimo, Kelowna and Abbotsford.**
