






### TOP 5 DESTINATION BY MUNICIPALITY

## 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- » Over **2,700 GARs** arrived in BC in 2023, including those that moved from elsewhere in BC and other provinces. This total was made up of 1,213 family units.
- » Over a quarter of GAR arrivals in 2023 arrived between October and December. The arrivals in this final quarter of the year included a higher percentage of GARs originally from Africa, most prominently the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).
- » The top 5 source countries for GAR arrivals in BC during 2023 were Afghanistan (54%), Democratic Republic of the Congo (8%), Syria (18%), Sudan (3%), and Somalia (4%).
- » In terms of age breakdown for those arriving in 2023, 54% of the **GAR** arrivals were between 19 and 64, while 45% were under 18 years old.
- » The top 5 municipalities that received **GAR** arrivals were Surrey (70%), Burnaby (4%), Delta (5%), Langley (3%), and Abbotsford (3%).
- » Dari and Pashto, the languages most widely spoken in Afghanistan, were the first and third most widely spoken languages by **GAR** arrivals in 2023, 33% and 21% respectively, with Arabic as second at 24%.
