







#### LOOKING AHEAD

- » In 2023, **ISSofBC** is targeted to welcome 2,650 Government Assisted Refugees to Metro Vancouver through our Vancouver and Surrey Resettlement Assistance Programs.
- » Although we continue to welcome large numbers of arrivals from **Afghanistan** (51%) and **Syria** (18%), there continues to be significant diversity with newcomers coming from 20 countries this quarter.
- » In addition to those destined directly to Metro Vancouver, we have welcomed 203 secondary migrants from other provinces in Canada.
